

The Kidnappers Coast starts at Clive. Pedal the flats to Black Bridge and over the river to the charming Cape Coast Arts Heritage Trail out to Clifton. • 15-30 km return

Also from Clive, head to Black Bridge and turn inland to Havelock North, overlooking vineyards, orchards and the Tukituki River, Enjoy the changing scenery, the golden syrupy light at dawn and dusk, with views of majestic Te Mata Peak. Enjoy the cafes and wineries beside the trail. • 42 km return
